
Congratulations to Joan Earl and Thelma Moresi who played in a composite team which won the NCPA Ladies State Fours. The team will compete at Regional Level in March.



Pool season

Pool Season for 24/25 began on 16 November 2024.

Loddon Shire has five swimming pools within the municipality, located at Boort, Inglewood, Mitiamo, Pyramid Hill and Wedderburn.

Fire Danger Period

Fire Danger Period for Loddon Shire began at 1am on 4 November 2024 and finishes on 1 May 2025, unless lifted earlier by the Country Fire Authority (CFA).

This means that fires cannot be lit in the open air without a written permit from the CFA.

Fire Danger Periods are based on local conditions and take into account fuel moisture, fuel loads, grassland curing, weather and rainfall.

Lighting a fire in the open without a permit is an offence and can bring penalties.

Barbeques and fires for cooking and warmth do not require a permit but must be lit in properly constructed fireplaces.

The use of an incinerator, chainsaw/lawn mower, welding/grinding equipment and vehicles that come in contact with vegetation and machinery with an internal combustion/heat engine are permitted, provided conditions are followed.

"It has been an honour to work with Neil and we wish him all the best for the future."



Snake Bite

We are now well into the time of year where snakes are becoming more prevalent as the weather heats up. We have already had several snake bites across the region in the last 2 months!

All snake bites can be potentially life threatening and need to be treated as a medical emergency

Venom from the wound or clothing can be used to detect if venom has been inflicted the wound and for that reason do not wash or suck the wound or discard any clothing.

You do not need to catch or identify the type of snake!

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

- Severe pain around the bite
- Swelling, bruising or bleeding
- Bite marks (may be obvious puncture wounds or almost invisible small scratches)
- Nausea and/or vomiting
- Dizziness
- Blurred vision
- Headache
- Difficulty breathing
- Stomach pain
- Difficulty swallowing
- Tingling, stinging, burning or abnormal feelings of the skin

Saving lives is a team effort and the community is a vital part of the team.

WHAT TO DO

- Follow DRSABCD.
- 2 Call triple zero (000) for an ambulance.
- Lie the patient down and ask them to keep still. Reassure the patient.
- 4 If on a limb, apply an elasticised roller bandage (10–15 cm wide) over the bite site as soon as possible.

Apply a further elasticised roller bandage (10–15 cm wide), starting just above the fingers or toes and moving upwards on the bitten limb as far as can be reached.



Apply the bandage as tightly as possible to the limb.

- 5 Immobilise the bandaged limb using splints.
- 6 Keep the patient lying down and completely still (immobilised).
- 7 Write down the time of the bite and when the bandage was applied. If possible, mark the location of the bite site (if known) on the skin with a pon, or photograph the site.
- 8 Stay with the patient until medical aid arrives.
