To support both his brother, Dylan, who was diagnosed with cancer and started chemotherapy in September 2024, and the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre (Peter Mac), Chris Hatcher dreamt up a plan to raise money.

He and some mates set a goal to run from Peter Mac in Melbourne to Boort (approximately 270kms) within 24 hours. With the help of a support crew, individual runners would run between 40-50kms each.

Late morning on Sunday 29 December 2024, eleven runners were greeted at the entrance to Boort and cheered on by a strong crowd. Then what looked like a pack of 100 runners fell in behind to support the lads on the final 3kms of their journey around the lake, finishing at the Boort Tennis Club. Later, supporters gathered at the Boort Tennis Club to enjoy an afternoon of BBQ, refreshments and entertainment.


